Samoan:

"E vave taunu'u le malaga pe a tatou alo va'a fa'atasi"- Our destiny is within sight when wepaddle our canoe together Palauan:

"A ungil merreder aua chull el melemedem era daob"- A good leader, like rain, still the ocean

We are Ocean People. We are Future Ancestors.

- Colonialism has concealed so much of canoe voyaging knowledge.
- But with the help of the stars and sea, the canoe not only gives us
 a sense of belonging, but creates an entire community.
 - The canoe helps pass on knowledge to the future generations, which can heal part of their ancestors colonial violence by continuing passing on the tradition.
 - Canoes create healing and commonality within cultures.

Marshallese:
"Wa kuk wa jimor" - Canoes
bring people together

Hawaiian:

"He wa'a he moku; He moku he wa'a " - The canoe is an island, the island is a canoe
